The Hamden Regional Chamber of Commerce honored Cheshire physical therapist **Kim Hopkins**, **PT, DPT**, and **volunteer Garrett Mendez** as 2023 Healthcare Warriors at a recent ceremony at the Cascade.

Kim Hopkins was recognized for creating and launching the successful Exercise4Life (EX4L) Program after identifying a gap in postrehabilitation services and exercise programs for people with spinal cord injuries, paralysis and other disabilities. EX4L is a no-cost, high-intensity

exercise class to designed to improve participants' health, quality of life, and independent living skills.

"Kim is a relentless patient advocate and always makes decisions in the best interest of those under her care," said Phil Silverio, Kim's supervisor. Learn more about the EX4L program in her recent feature article in Rehab Management.

An acquired brain injury peer mentor for more than six years, Garrett Mendez was a former Gaylord patient after experiencing a brain stem stroke following an ice hockey injury. Every week, Garrett travels to Gaylord Hospital to visit young brain injury and stroke patients and share his story of recovery, hope, and encouragement.

"Garrett fills that gap area between the patient and the medical care provider who knows how to treat the brain injury or stroke, but doesn't know what it is like to have one," said Elle Maron, patient experience and volunteer liaison. "My goal is to give patients a little lift and hopefully a little spark to make them work a bit harder," Garrett said. Garrett is prominently featured in the now-airing "Hospital of the Future" episode of "Travels and Traditions with Burt Wolf."

Room Dedication a "Fitting Tribute" to Beloved SLP, Deirdre Bray



Gaylord inpatient speech therapists came together to celebrate the legacy of former SLP Deirdre Bray who positively impacted the lives of countless patients and colleagues throughout her 11-year Gaylord career.

Deirdre, who passed away in 2018, was remembered by Sonja LaBarbera as a fierce patient advocate whose kindness continues to inspire the inpatient speech team to ask, "What would Deirdre do?"

"Every time I walk down the Luscomb hallway, I still feel her energy," Sonja reflected.

"When I think of Deirdre, I am inspired to be a little kinder. No matter how busy she was, she always had time for a chat, a smile ... a professional opinion. She would do anything within her power to make patients better."

"She was our resident nature-lover and every day she would fill the bird feeders in the Japanese garden. One time I asked why she did that. She said that by feeding the birds and squirrels, the patients could see nature up close through the window it gave them something to look at while they were waiting for therapy. And that just tells you about Deirdre ... it was always about what she could do to make someone else's life better."

Deirdre's former office, Luscomb 143, was recently dedicated in her honor with a plaque unveiling and ribbon cutting ceremony attended by her husband, son, sisters and granddaughter.

"The bond that my mom had with her fellow 'speechies' was incredible," remembered son, Keith. "Her Gaylord colleagues are the most wonderful group of people I know outside of our family."

"Deirdre sang every day on her way to work, she adored Gaylord so," said her sister Keavy Peterson. "She loved her patients who were always first and foremost in her mind."

"Today was an incredible day," reflected Mel, Deirdre's husband of 43 years. "To have her honored in this way means the world to us."

Opportunity

Patients on non-formulary medication are not eligible for admission due to drug unavailability and high cost. Patients on non-formulary medications placed on hold at acute care but need to resume the medication at Gaylord are only identified after admission.

Innovation

A team developed a Non-Formulary Management Protocol to compare a prospective patient's acute care, home and on-hold medications against the Gaylord Medication Formulary before admission authorization. A plan for obtaining a patient's medication from home is put in place before admission.

Today

Our Regional Healthcare Nurses identify non-formulary medications to be used for the patient while at Gaylord. Pharmacy streamlined the Patient Own Medications Process to manage inventory better. In the first two months of using this new protocol, Gaylord was able to admit 11 patients that would not have been eligible and saved \$162,109 in unexpected non-formulary medication costs.





Opportunity

Multiple wires and cables were hanging off of patient beds, posing a significant risk to patient and staff safety through tripping hazards and electrical shocks.

Innovation

The Facilities and Agiliti teams designed and implemented a wire management program to address the problem, which included using shorter cables, wire ties and clips that helped organize the cables reducing the associated risks.

Today

Patients and staff can now move around the bed without fear of tripping. The solution also significantly reduces the risk of damage to medical equipment, as cables are less likely to be pulled or disconnected.





Opportunity

Traditional CNA programs are taught in a skilled nursing facility which does not adequately prepare CNAs to work with the complex patient population at Gaylord.

Innovation

Gaylord created the CNA Academy, which provides classroom and clinical instruction in the unique environment of a long-term acute care hospital (LTACH).

Today

CNA Academy students are thoroughly prepared to deliver high-quality patient care to our unique patient population. To date, 23 students have successfully completed the CNA program, and 18 students transitioned from a CNA Academy graduate to a Gaylord PCT, which has helped alleviate staff vacancies.





Opportunity

New nurses were often assigned multiple nurse preceptors throughout their orientation period. With a consistent preceptor, providing a high-quality learning experience and establishing a relationship as a mentor is easier. Support and mentorship are critical to the new nurse orientation experience and retention.

Innovation

A new preceptor model was developed and piloted. The preceptors in the pilot received formal preceptor education. In this model, the new nurse would be assigned one primary preceptor. The pair would be placed on the same schedule. Weekly check-ins were required during the orientation period, with bi-weekly check-ins for the first year of employment. As a reward for their dedication and support to the new employee, retention bonuses would be paid to the preceptor.

Today

The pilot program is ongoing. Survey results and subjective feedback have been overwhelmingly positive from the pilot participants. Seven new nurses participated in this pilot. Six of those nurses continue to work at Gaylord today and are doing very well.





Opportunity

The Telemetry team identified multiple opportunities to optimize workflow, address alarm fatigue, improve interdisciplinary communication, and manage equipment.

Innovation

The telemetry team collaborated with multiple disciplines to develop and implement several changes. Telemetry equipment storage was moved to an area with increased visualization with a process implemented to monitor equipment inventory. This change ensures equipment is available to meet our patient needs and eliminates costly last-minute purchase requests. The team also identified reports that could automatically be printed to the room when orders are initiated or discontinued. The automatic notifications serve as a back-up if there is a lapse in communication with nursing. Alarm fatigue and the frequency of certain alarms created gaps in communication with nursing. An Alarm Fatigue Taskforce identified three telemetry alarms that frequently alerted the nurses phones.

Today

The Alarm Fatigue Taskforce recommended that three identified telemetry phone alarms be removed from the nurse's phones, significantly decreasing alarm notifications and improving communication between telemetry and nursing. The CMT's continue to work with the Alarm Fatigue group to identify opportunities to reduce alarms. The current focus is determining how to prevent telemetry leads from coming off the patient as it is the top reason telemetry needs to contact nursing staff.


Research Updates

The Milne Institute would like to share some fast facts and highlights from the last 6-months.

- We are currently tracking 78 projects at varying stages of completion.
- There are **21 IRB** approved studies, of which:
 - 15 were continued from the last fiscal year.
 - 5 were approved in the last 6 months.
 - 1 was recently closed.
- We celebrated 3 published peer-reviewed manuscripts (with 2 more under review):

 - -Weil KA, Baumann V, Brown B, Nadeau R, Gerstenhaber B, & Manning EP. The association between beta-natriuretic peptide (BNP) serum levels and liberation from mechanical ventilation. Journal of Pulmonary Medicine & Respiratory Research.
- Submitted 7 conference abstracts, with 2 accepted thus far.
- Pursuing 16 Product Development opportunities and/or relationships.


