Verizon asked that we share the steps and that "Verizon periodically requests employees to confirm their eligibility by asking them to validate their current employment. This will ensure that they are still eligible to receive this benefit. When we request employees to validate their current employment, this applies to all customers who receive employee discounts. This effort is not focused on your company alone."

#### To Complete Registration or Validation via Work Email Address:

- Go to the Verizon Discount Portal
- Choose Existing Verizon Customers
- Enter either an existing mobile telephone number or My Verizon login ID
- Choose Log in and Validate
- Once logged in, select Validate by Email Address
- Enter the work email address (twice) and select Validate by Email Address
- A confirmation email will be sent to the work email address provided
- Click on the link enclosed in the email within 72 hours to complete validation
- If not validated within 72 hours, begin the process over and resubmit the request

#### To Register or Validate by Paystub:

- Go to the <u>Verizon Discount Portal</u>
- Choose Existing Verizon Customers
- Enter either an existing mobile telephone number or My Verizon login ID
- Choose Log in and Validate
- Once logged in, select Validate by Paystub
- Complete the customer and employer information on the Employment Validation Form and select Continue
- Select Choose File to pick a paystub or other proof of employment or affiliation
  - The paystub must be issued within the last 60 days
  - Please black out any sensitive personal information
- Choose Upload My Paystub
- After review, a status notification will be emailed

#### Looking for Research Study Participants

Clinical Comparison of Patellofemoral Pain Syndrome Outcomes after Blood Flow Restriction Training is an outpatient study conducted across Gaylord's outpatient physical therapy sites. Participants from the community are eligible to participate as long as they are over 16 years old, have Patellofemoral Pain Syndrome (pain at the front of the knee), and will be attending outpatient therapy.

The study involves using blood flow restriction (BFR) during therapy exercises to assess if there is a benefit to the patient's recovery and pain reduction across time. While BFR is often used in PT sessions, it has not been used in this targeted population with a focus on Patient Reported Outcome Measures and objective strength measures.

The treating Primary Investigators for this study are Dani Letendre in Wallingford and Eric Sokolowski in Cheshire. Stephanie Belanger in Cromwell and Corey Podbielski in Madison are also treating investigators in this study. With support from the Research Department, this study is up and running! During a PT evaluation, potential participants are identified by having a diagnosis of PFPS.

This is where we need your help - if you identify someone that has PFPS, please share the study flyer with them and let the study therapist at your site know. They can talk further with the person about the study, share the consent form, and enroll them in the study. Please contact any investigator if you would like to learn more about the study. stenosis at 83, it was difficult to realize that I wasn't the young athlete I used to be.

Shane provided not just routines for me but carefully demonstrated what they were. If I had a problem doing them, he was right there with me with a smile and worked me through so easily that I laughed at how easy I was doing it.

Each visit, we would do them again and expand the number of times. After about three visits, I was actually enjoying what he was teaching me and was happy with the progress. I reached a point where I regretted the session being over and looked forward to his great greeting and smile at the next session."

Another patient states: "Shane was always genuinely upbeat and encouraging. He saw me as an individual and tailored my therapy to my personal abilities, needs, and goals. I feel he went the extra mile explaining how to attain my recovery goals and creating exercise workouts that have helped me continue to make progress at home. It was an excellent experience, and I highly recommend working with Shane at the Madison facility."

The last patient states: "Shane is always ready to help, is positive, has a great sense of humor, and always listens. He is the best kind of person for the job."

The Safety Coaches have selected to recognize the Near Miss submitted in RL by Bridgette Eroh, LPN recognizing Telesitter Teresa Stefanek and her use of CHAMP Tool: **ARCC it up (A**sk, **Request, Concern, Chain of Command)**. Teresa was monitoring a patient via video when she noted suspicious activity by the family. She voiced her concern to Bridgette, who was able to prevent a visitor from giving the patient a medication that had already been prescribed and administered. Bridgette notified the Nursing Supervisor, who contacted Pharmacy, all working to ensure patient safety.

#### **Employee Prescription Drug Memo**

Dear ConnectiCare Medical Insurance Members,

Over the past several months, we have been working with ConnectiCare to rectify the issues you may have been experiencing with your prescription drug coverage. Early on in January 2023, it was brought to our attention that several employees were denied previously agreed to prescription drugs at no cost. Further investigation revealed this was not isolated to a few drugs but many. We sincerely apologize for the inconveniences experienced and more so, monies that you have paid for assumed prescription drug coverage.

Today, we are pleased to let you know that we have an update with regards to ConnectiCare's prescription drug pricing. ConnectiCare will now list a significant number of prescription drugs as \$0 copay. These drugs had previously been listed as deductible-free, but with a copay applied. Please see the list of \$0 copay medications (Preventive Drug List) included with this update. There is also an attached ACA drug list that has additional medications included with a \$0 copay.

ConnectiCare has put these changes into effect on March 30, 2023, but the revised \$0 copay policy will be retroactive to 1/1/2023. Reimbursements will be done automatically on your behalf and there is no need to submit a reimbursement claim. If you purchased any prescription drug now covered by a \$0 copay from January 1, 2023 through March 29, 2023, you can expect to receive a refund through check or credits from ConnectiCare within five to six weeks. Your deductible may be affected by these refund amounts.

ConnectiCare's \$0 copay policy applies to generic and brand-name medications on its Preventive Drug List. These medications treat some common health conditions, including asthma, diabetes, high blood pressure and more. We want to make it easy for our members to get the care they need. Especially preventive care, which can help prevent health problems from becoming serious.

The federal government decides what medications are most important for preventive health. And we cover those at 100% when you meet certain age and gender requirements; have a prescription from a health care provider (even for over-the-counter, or OTC, medicines); and fill your prescription at an in-network pharmacy.

**Aspirin** – To prevent cardiovascular disease and colon cancer in men and women, and preeclampsia in pregnant women after 12 weeks gestation who are at high risk.

Who's covered? Adults under age 70

What's covered? Generic over-the-counter products only, up to 325 mg when prescribed by a physician

Examples: aspirin chewable 81 mg

aspirin enteric coated tablet 325 mg

#### Cholesterol/Statins – To prevent cardiovascular disease for individuals at high risk.

**Who's covered?** Adults age 40 – 75 with one or more cardiovascular risk factors, such as dyslipidemia, diabetes, hypertension or smoking

**What's covered?** Select generic strengths of low- to moderate-dose statins for primary prevention of cardiovascular disease

**Examples:** atorvastatin

fluvastatin lovastatin pravastatin rosuvastatin simvastatin

#### **Oral Fluoride** – To prevent cavities in children 6 months through 16 years of age whose water is low in fluoride.

Who's covered? Children age 6 months through 16 years

**What's covered?** Generic only (prescription/over-the-counter) single entity and combo products providing up to 1 mg/day when prescribed by a physician

**Examples:** sodium fluoride chewable tablet 0.25 to 0.5 mg

sodium fluoride solution 0.25 mg to 0.5 mg/ml oral drops

tri-vit with fluoride 0.25 mg to 0.5 mg/ml

#### Folic Acid – To prevent birth defects in women who are planning and capable of pregnancy.

Who's covered? Women through age 50

**What's covered?** Generic only (prescription/over-the-counter) 0.4 mg – 0.8 mg single entity as well as combo products when prescribed by a physician

**Examples:** folic acid 0.4 mg (400 mcg)

folic acid 0.8 mg (800 mcg)

**Smoking Cessation** – To help adults quit tobacco use in order to prevent future health-related issues.

Who's covered? Adults 18 years of age and older

What's covered? All FDA-approved tobacco cessation products (prescription/over-the-counter) when prescribed by a physician

Examples: bupropion HCL SR 150 mg (ZYBAN 150 mg)

**CHANTIX** 

nicotine 21 mg/24 hr patch

**Bowel Preps** – Agents used to cleanse the bowel prior to colonoscopy. Colonoscopies screen for colorectal and related cancers.

Who's covered? Adults age 50 to 75

**What's covered?** Generic only (prescription/over-the-counter) when prescribed by a physician (limit 2 prescriptions per 365 days)

**Examples:** gavilyte – h kit

peg 3350 powder peg-prep kit

**Immunizations** – To prevent certain illness in people of all ages. Provider must adhere to the FDA/CDC age/frequency/gender guidelines.

**Examples:** Diphtheria Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)

Meningococcal

Hepatitis A

Pneumococcal

Rotavirus

HIV Prep – To prevent Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV).

Who's covered? Persons of any age lacking a history of treatment for HIV

What's covered? TRUVADA - 200 mg/300 mg dose only

Breast Cancer Prevention – For the primary prevention of women at increased risk of breast cancer.\*

Who's covered? "High risk" women 35 years of age and older who meet criteria

What's covered? Generic tamoxifen and raloxifene when prescribed by a physician and clinical criteria are met



#### April Safety Habit: **Attention to Detail**



#### **Attention to Detail**

#### What should we do?

■ Pay attention to the task at hand to avoid unintentional skill-based errors

#### Why should we do this?

- To avoid those slips or lapses where the hand is operating before the head
- To reduce the chance that we'll make an error when we're under time pressure, distracted or stressed

#### **Error Prevention Tool**

■ Self check using STAR

#### **Self-Check Using STAR**

- **S**TOP Pause for 1 to 2 seconds to focus our attention on the task at hand
- **THINK** Consider the action you're about to take
  - **ACT** Concentrate and carry out the task
- **REVIEW** Check to make sure that the task was done correctly and that you got the correct result

STOP is the most important step. It gives your brain a chance to catch up with what your hands are getting ready to do.



#### **Slap-Your-Head Moments**



Conditions that increase the chance you will experience an unintended error when performing a familiar, routine task:

- Working under time pressure
- Doing multiple things at the same time
- **Distractions**
- Interruptions
- **Boredom**
- Mental or physical exhaustion
- Disorientation
- Just not paying attention




