

#### SCIMS Update



During this highly competitive grant cycle the Spaulding New England Regional Spinal Cord

Injury Center (SNERSCIC) will be involved in a variety of projects. Gaylord and Spaulding Rehab Hospital are collaborating partners in SNERSCIC. The focus of the entire SCI Model System program is National Spinal Cord Injury Model Systems (SCIMS) Database, the longestrunning SCI database in the world. Inpatients with a new SCI will have the opportunity to enroll in the study while here. SNERSCIC continues with follow-up interviews across people's lifespans and in this cycle, interviews with people who have been injured for 45+ years are being conducted. Participation in the SCI database allows people to enroll in multi-site collaborative studies that include Acute SCI Injury Outcomes Associated to Early Opioid Administration, Exploring the Impact of Social Networks for Persons with SCI, and Equity and Quality in Assistive Technology 3.0, (EQuATe 3.0). One of the exciting updates to the EQuATe 3.0 study is the inclusion of SMART technology acquisition and use in the study.

Gaylord will participate in trialing enrollment into the database with people admitted here with a non-traumatic SCI. The success of this trial will potentially open up research opportunities in the SCI Model Systems for a large population of people with non-traumatic SCI who experience many of the same concerns and issues as those with traumatic SCIs.

Each SCI Model System is also required to provide knowledge dissemination and education about living with an SCI to patients, their families, and care professionals. Working with the Rehabilitation Outcomes Center at Spaulding, our Model System staff will participate in Knowledge in Motion lecture webinars, podcasts, and develop infographics for The New England Regional SCI Toolkit topics.

During this mock evaluation, we will have you fill out a medical history, pain diagram, and outcomes form so that staff can review prior to evaluation date. On mock evaluation date, you would come in expecting to be the patient in a group evaluation setting. Clinicians will utilize this as a learning/ collaboration opportunity and you would get the benefit of beginning the process of addressing your pain/limitation.

\*If we get far enough in the process, we will be able to give you some education, suggestions, or possibly exercises to start off with. You will then have the opportunity to schedule a formal evaluation where whatever objective measures were not done would be finished and formal treatment can be administered.\*

Heroic Efforts From Our Safety-Minded Staff

A near miss is an event that might have resulted in harm but the problem did not reach the patient because of timely intervention by our amazing staff.

The Safety Coaches have chosen to recognize the Near Miss Jaime Lorusso, from Inpatient Therapy, submitted in November demonstrating the importance of practicing a questioning attitude. Jaime used the CHAMP tool: validate and verify, stopped the line and raised concern for the patient who no longer had a pelvic belt in place. The restraint was unintentionally omitted and after clarifying, Jamie was able to rectify the situation and prevent potential harm to the patient.

February Safety Topic:
Near Miss Reporting



# Please take the time to submit an Occurrence Report when you identify a NEAR MISS safety event.



#### Why?

#### Because learning of a **NEAR MISS** allows us to:

- Take action
- Correct the process or eliminate the hazard
- Before the error or problem happens again
- And hurts a patient, staff or visitor

#### **NEAR MISS examples:**

- Incorrect diet on meal tray noted <u>before</u> it is delivered to the patient room.
- Incorrect medication order questioned by nurse and order corrected <u>before</u> patient medicated.
- Incorrect information printed on ID band found just **before** it was placed on patient's wrist.

#### What is a NEAR MISS safety event?

We call an occurrence a NEAR MISS when:

The error is **caught** or the hazard is corrected before it reaches/affects a patient, staff, or visitor.

Includes both when the catch occurs because of built-in checks or barriers, and when it occurs by luck.
