Heroic Efforts From Our Safety-Minded Staff

A near miss is an event that might have resulted in harm but the problem did not reach the patient because of timely intervention by our amazing staff.

The Safety Coaches have selected to celebrate the Near Miss submitted in May by Finn LaPierre, an outpatient physical therapist in North Haven. Finn, along with coworkers, prevented a fall when a patient had increased spasticity, causing their knee to buckle. Their Attention to detail, and use of CHAMP tool: STAR: Stop Think Act Review was demonstrated in the use of a gait belt for contact guard ambulation, enabling them to prevent a patient fall.
