

Recently the Outpatient Patient Access Team transitioned over to centralized registration and it turned out to be very successful for the organization. It all started back in August when a team of staff members (Ronell Donovan, Jamie Gambardella, Belen Garcia, Madelyn Sola, Chris Hayes, Leigh Golembiewski, Natasha Dempsey and Cheryl Joyner) embarked on a Lean Project to review the front end processes in an effort to find some efficiency gains. They looked at Gaylord's current referral pending list and determined that tasks were separated out to be the priority task for a selected group of intake reps. We may be able to improve how fasts the patients can get scheduled but also keep the pending list at a manageable size. They focused on tools, resources and training for those individual staff members. The results were amazing:

- Able to review the other intake rep positions that would no longer be responsible for the task and improve on efficiency within their roles
- Reduced the overtime required for this task by 30% in Wallingford
- Started to push the envelope on the 48 hour turnaround of a referral to actually turning it around in 24 hours

Not only were we able to get patients in the door and to the care they need more quickly by dedicating a designated group of staff to the pending list, but we are also finding that patients are interacting more effectively with the intake reps focusing on patient-facing care. HR UPDATE:

New Human Resource Management System Coming!

In 2022, a cross-functional team across Gaylord explored various Human Resources systems to meet our HR needs present and future as Kronos will be retiring Workforce Central (WFC) and Human Resources/Payroll (HRPR) platforms as of 2024. We are pleased to announce that UKGPro/Dimensions will be Gaylord's new HRMS (Human Resources Management system).



Behind the scenes, HR, Finance, IT and Nursing have been meeting with the implementation team from UKG to streamline processes and functionality for Gaylord's new system. The goal is for our employees to have greater access to their personal information, payroll, benefits and nursing schedules. Other features will include performance management, a learning management system (LMS), talent acquisition and talent management record keeping. From what we have seen in all of the testing and explorations for a new system, UKG is extremely user friendly and intuitive.



Some important things to know:

UKGPro will be replacing Kronos HRPR.

<u>Functions:</u> Houses all employee information, benefits, positions, job descriptions compensation, performance management, learning management, talent acquisition, talent management and nurse scheduling.

Dimensions is replacing Workforce Central (WFC).

Functions: A time entry and leave management system capturing hours worked and leave time. Supervisor led for time sheets, change requests, and time off requests approvals. Information ports to the payroll system.

Build Timeline: 39 weeks, Go Live January 2024

Looking for Research Study Participants

Clinical Comparison of Patellofemoral Pain Syndrome Outcomes after Blood Flow Restriction Training is an outpatient study conducted across Gaylord's outpatient physical therapy sites. Participants from the community are eligible to participate as long as they are over 16 years old, have Patellofemoral Pain Syndrome, and will be attending outpatient therapy.

The study involves using blood flow restriction (BFR) during therapy exercises to assess if there is a benefit to the patient's recovery and pain reduction across time. While BFR is often used in PT sessions, it has not been used in this targeted population with a focus on Patient Reported Outcome Measures and objective strength measures.

The treating Primary Investigators for this study are Dani Letendre in Wallingford and Eric Sokolowski in Cheshire. Stephanie Belanger in Cromwell and Corey Podbielski in Madison are also treating investigators in this study. With support from the Research Department, this study is up and running! During a PT evaluation, potential participants are easily identified by having a diagnosis of PFPS.

This is where we need your help - if you identify someone that has PFPS, please share the study flyer with them and let the study therapist at your site know. They can talk further with the person about the study, share the consent form, and enroll them in the study. Please contact any investigator if you would like to learn more about the study. 


