



Inpatient Therapy, Radiology, and Respiratory Departments Hold a Chocolate Chip Cookie Contest



Comparing the Efficacy of Grounding Techniques in Alleviating Pain among Long-Term Acute Care Hospital Inpatients





Grounding is a process that connects the human body to the earth, which has natural electrical charges that can provide a wide range of benefits to the body¹. In a clinical study on the effects of grounding on bodyworkers' pain, participants experienced increased physical function and energy and decreased levels of fatigue, depressed mood, and tiredness compared to the control group.² Mindfulness is the act of paying attention to the present moment and is also beneficial for relieving stress and anxiety.³ To the best of our knowledge, research connecting mindfulness with grounding has not been widely studied, especially in the LTACH setting. Therefore, the goal of this pilot study is to show the feasibility of the protocol in the LTACH setting and to collect preliminary efficacy data to determine if it is possible that grounding can improve a patient's physical pain. Together, we hypothesize that grounding paired with mindfulness will improve patients' physical pain compared to mindfulness and outdoor therapy alone.
